Foreign disapproval won't affect US voters

● I have a small but significant piece of evidence that the world is desperate to rediscover its esteem for America and its people. At a recent international theatre gathering of young people in Liverpool – a diverse mix of about 250, ages between 16 and 25, from countries including Palestine, Nepal, Turkey, Brazil, India, Poland, Zambia, and Germany – a group from the US presented a play about race issues. There was a passing reference to Obama and a hope expressed that he will become the next president. This whole gathering – with all its wide differences of cultures, faiths, and economic, social and political backgrounds – rose to its feet as one body with a mighty cheer and applauded. If only the people of America could hear that message.
